NC Lawyer Referral Service

A nonprofit public service sponsored by the North Carolina Bar Association Foundation. This service provides referrals to attorneys in good standing, is able to answer your legal questions and if necessary will provide representation. This service does not make referrals to pro bono or free attorneys.

The Elder Law Clinic – Wake Forest University School of Law

713-8630

Provides free legal assistance for low to moderate-income seniors 60 years of age or older. Some of the cases the Elder Law Clinic handles include: wills, living wills, health care powers of attorney, powers of attorney, Medicaid for nursing home care, Medicaid estate recovery claims, guardianship, nursing home concerns, fraud, and consumer problems. Individuals must complete and return an Eligibility Questionnaire to The Elder Law Clinic. Upon receipt of the completed Eligibility Questionnaire, The Elder Law Clinic will determine if an individual qualifies for assistance. If an individual does qualify for assistance, The Elder Law Clinic will mail the individual a letter stating that his/her name has been added to their waiting list.
