Transportation Services

Ardmore Transportation Ministry722-5686

Ardmore Transportation Ministry of Highland Presbyterian Church, Ardmore Methodist Church, & Ardmore Baptist Church provides transportation for seniors living in the Ardmore community. Volunteers assist with transportation within the Winston-Salem area to medical appointments, the pharmacy, and the grocery store. Volunteers use their personal cars- they do not have a wheelchair accessible van. There is no cost for their service but donations are accepted. To register or schedule a ride, clients need to call Monday-Friday between 10 am-noon.

Clemmons Transportation Ministry766-6486

Clemmons Transportation Ministry of Clemmons First Baptist Church provides transportation for senior and disabled adults living in the town of Clemmons. Volunteers assist with transportation to medical appointments, the pharmacy, and the grocery store. Volunteers use their personal cars- they do not have a wheelchair accessible van. Clients that use a wheelchair must be able to transfer themselves in and out of the car. There is no cost for their service but donations are accepted. Clemmons Transportation Ministry prefers a one-week notice for scheduling transportation.

Lewisville Transportation Ministry945-3203

Lewisville Transportation Ministry of Lewisville United Methodist Church provides transportation for senior and disabled adults living in the town of Lewisville. Volunteers assist with transportation to medical appointments, the pharmacy, and the grocery store. Volunteers use their personal cars- they do not have a wheelchair accessible van. There is no cost for their service but donations are accepted.

The Shepherd's Center of Greater Winston-Salem.....748-0217

The Shepherd's Center of Greater Winston-Salem provides medical transportation and transportation to the grocery store for clients 50 years of age and over living in the Winston-Salem/ Forsyth County area. Volunteers use their personal cars- they do not have a wheelchair accessible van. There is no cost for their service but donations are accepted. Persons needing transportation need to contact The Shepherd's Center of Greater Winston-Salem by Wednesday, one week in advance of their appointment, to schedule transportation. Clients can receive only one ride per week.

The Shepherd's Center of Kernersville 996-6696
 The Shepherd's Center of Kernersville provides transportation for any local trip (bank, beauty shop, pharmacy, etc.) within Kernersville for clients 50 years of age and over or younger clients on permanent disability residing in or near the Kernersville area. They also provide medical transportation into Winston-Salem, Greensboro, and High Point. Volunteers use their personal cars- they do not have a wheelchair accessible van. Clients that use a wheelchair must be able to transfer themselves in and out of the car. There is no cost for their service but donations are accepted. The Shepherd's Center of Kernersville needs a notice of two working days for scheduling transportation and transportation is dependent on volunteer availability.

Trans-Aid727-2000
 Trans-Aid provides regional non-emergency transportation within Forsyth County. Clients are asked to contribute 50 cents per one-way trip or they can purchase a 30-day pass/ fare card for \$15 at the Hampton D. Haith Administration Building (located at 1060 N. Trade Street- open Monday-Friday 8am-5pm). Clients may not be required to pay if they are an eligible Trans-Aid rider receiving Medicaid. Clients need to register with Trans-Aid and can make reservations up to 14 days in advance of the needed transportation. Trans-Aid operates Monday-Friday 8am-5pm (transportation on Saturdays is mostly for dialysis patients). Reservations can be made by calling 727-2000 Monday- Friday between 5:30am- 11:30pm or on Saturdays between 6:30am - 6:30pm.

Private Pay Transportation Services

In addition to the volunteer agencies and publicly funded programs listed above, there are also private pay resources for seniors needing transportation. ***Senior Services, Inc. does not make a recommendation of any of the transportation providers listed below, but is glad to provide this list for your information and use.***

Here 2 There Van Service.....923-5561 or 923-5562
 Here 2 There Van Service provides personal round-trip services. Their service area is primarily Winston-Salem but they may consider trips to surrounding cities and towns in Forsyth County. They provide transportation for daily, weekly, and monthly pleasures of shopping, medical appointments, barber/beauty shops, flea markets, etc. Here 2 There Van Service prefers a 24 hr notice and there is no registration. Costs range from \$12 - \$17 round-trip, depending on where person is being picked-up. Vans have low step and they do have wheelchair accessible vans. There is no age requirement for their program.
